From the top down these levels are: 1. Leadership has to take up the necessary changes required for quality improvement and encourage a sense of quality throughout organisation. Support from top management is vital to the success of any QMS implementation. Improvement must allow pauses between implementing new changes so that the change is stabilized and assessed as a real improvement, before the next improvement is made hence continual improvement, not continuous improvement.
